Traffic Performance

V.O. Chidambaranar Port handled 16.55 Million Tonnes of cargo during this financial year upto September, 2020, as against 18.27 Million Tonnes handled during the corresponding period of previous year, registering a decrease of 9.41%.

The Port handled 3,52,939 TEUs. of containers during the current financial year upto the month of September, 2020, as against 4,25,260 TEUs. of containers handled during the corresponding period of previous year, registering a decrease of 17.01%

Port handled longest windmill blades ever manufactured in India

On 21.09.2020, V.O. Chidambaranar Port handled windmill blades of length 74.90 metres, the longest of its kind handled through Indian Ports.

The Panama flagged vessel 'M.V. Ginkgo Arrow' was berthed at 23.30 Hrs on 15.09.2020 and loaded 50 windmill towers and 33 windmill blades. The Vessel completed loading and sailed from the Port on 21^{st} September, 2020 to the Port of New Orleans, USA.

The Port has handled 881 windmill blades and 397 Windmill blade towers during this Financial year upto 21st September. During the last financial year, the Port had handled 1667 windmill blades and 648 windmill blade towers making V.O. Chidambaranar Port, a premier gateway Port for export of Windmill blades.

Greetings from DSV India.

It gives us immense pleasure in writing to you and thanking for all the support we have been accorded over the last six months. Since the start of the initial phase itself we have been regularly having calls with your teams TM/DTM/ATM and various other depts within the port for planning and ensuring to make this project a huge success. As a first lot of movement we exported 36 blades on 21st September 2020 to New Orleans in the USA on G2 Ocean carrier.

This was the first time ever in the history of India a 75 Mtrs blade has been manufactured and the same moved on roads. This was mammoth task by itself considering the huge size and nature of the blade and was carrefully transported to Tuticorin port. The local transportation was carried out by Gangotri freight carriers and the local handling agents at port for the vessel was Pearl shipping. These blades were manufactured by TPI Composites on behalf of Vestas wind and the full door to door logistic solution was supplied by DSV a global logistics service.

We take this opportunity to once again thank each one of you and your teams in extending with all the required timely support during this very initial phase of this critical project given the constrains due to corona and unavailability of various other resources. We also look forward for the same support in future.

Port Created Single Day Container Handling Record



On 31.08.2020, V.O.Chidambaranar Port created a record by handling 5628 TEUs of Containers in a single day, bettering the previous best of 4524 TEUs handled on 25.08.2019.

For the first time in Port's history, Bunker fuel supplied through barge to ship



For the first time in the history of the Port, Bunker fuel was supplied to ship through Bunker Barge on 26.07.2020.

The self-propelled Bunker barge 'M.V. Shree Prakash' that has 5 tanks in Starboard side and Port side, with a capacity of carrying 1054 Tonnes, filled bunker fuel at Coal Jetty-1. Thereafter, it pumped 270 KL of fuel to the vessel M.V.Aeschylus Gracia, at berth No.4, conforming to the Safety, Security and Environment protocols. The bunker barge is capable of pumping bunker fuel at Berths and Anchorage.

It is notable that V.O.Chidambaranar Port, strategically located in the midst of East-West International sea route, has the right environment to provide fuel Bunkering services considering the calm sea, low waves and currents.


