






Hindi Corner

<u>राजभाषा की कहानी</u>

हम सभी जानते है कि हमारा देश इंडिया अनेकता में एकता के लिए जाना है। इसके अलावा भारत अपनी विविधताओं के दुनिया भर में प्रसिद्ध है। जिस प्रकार भारत में विभिन्न धर्म के लोग रहते हैं उसी तरह यहाँ कई सारी भाषा बोली है। उदाहरण के तौर पर जैसे उत्तर और मध्य भारत में मुख्यता हिन्दी भाषा सुनी जा सकती है। वहीं दक्षिण भारत की मुख्य भाषा कन्नड़, तेलुगु और तमिल है। पश्चिम में गुजराती, राजस्थानी, पंजाबी और हरियाणवी भाषाओं को सुना जा सकता है। पूर्वी भारत की बात करे तो यहाँ इनकी अपनी अलग भाषा है कुल मिलाकर भारत अनेक भाषाओं का देश है। आपकी जानकारी के लिए बता दे कि भारत की कोई नेशनल लैंग्वेज नहीं है और इसका कारण आप भी जान गए होंगे क्योंकि इंडिया में बहुत सारी भाषा बोली जाती है। ऐसे में किसी एक भाषा को नेशनल लैंग्वेज बनाने में काफी दिक्कतों का सामना करना पड़ सकता है। इंग्लैंड और अमेरिका जैसे देशों की राष्ट्रीय भाषा अंग्रेजी है क्योंकि उन देशों में ज्यादातर लोग अंग्रेजी बोलते और समझते हैं।

हालांकि इंडिया में करीब 40 फीसदी लोग हिंदी बोलते और समझते है। इसके अलावा यह देश की सबसे ज्यादा बोली जाने वाली भाषा है लेकिन फिर भी इसे नेशनल लैंग्वेज नहीं बनाया गया है। ऐसा नहीं है कि इसकी कोशिश नहीं की गयी हो कई बार हिन्दी को देश की राष्ट्रीय भाषा बनाने की पहल की गयी है लेकिन इसका विरोध देखने को मिलता है।

पूरे भारत में किनती भाषाएं बोली जाती है इसका सही तरीके से अनुमान लगाना तो मुश्किल है क्योंकि हिंदुस्तान में बहुत सी भाषाएँ बोली और समझी जाती है। हालांकि भारतीय संविधान में सिर्फ 22 भाषा को मान्यता प्राप्त है। लेकिन 2011 के आंकड़ों के अनुसार ऐसे लोग जो 10,000 से ज्यादा एक भाषा को बोलते हैं ऐसी 121 भाषाएं भारत में बोली और समझी जाती है।

हिन्दी और अंग्रेजी केंद्र सरकार की अधिकारिक भाषा है इसलिए आपको सभी सरकारी काम हिन्दी और इंग्लिश भाषा में देखने को मिलते है। हालांकि राज्य सरकार की अपनी अलग भाषा हो सकती है जैसे आप दक्षिण भारत में जाते हैं तो वहाँ आपको कन्नड, मलयालम, तेलुगु या फिर तमिल देखने को मिलेगी। भारत में 22 भाषा को संविधानिक रूप से आधिकारिक भाषा का दर्जा दिया गया है। भारत में अधिकांश लोग हिन्दी को राष्ट्रभाषा मानते हैं। देश में विकास करने वाले लगभग लोग हिन्दी को भली भांति समझते है, और हिन्दी बोलते हैं, परन्तु वह भी एक सत्य है कि हिन्दी भाषा देश की राष्ट्र भाषा नहीं बन पाई है क्योंकि, इस भाषा को अभी तक राष्ट्रभाषा के रूप में स्वीकार नहीं किया गया है। इस हिन्दी भाषा को भारत के संविधान में अनुच्छेद 343 के अंतर्गत भारत की राजभाषा के रूप में मान्यता दी गई थी, जिसके अंतर्गत हिन्दी का प्रयोग हम केवल राजकीय कार्य में ही कर सकते हैं।

किसी भी देश की संस्कृति का महत्वपूर्ण हिस्सा उसकी राष्ट्रभाषा होती है, जिसका प्रयोग लिखने, पढ़ने और वार्तालाप करने में किया जाता है। देश के महत्वपूर्ण कार्य उस देश की राष्ट्रभाषा में ही किये जाते हैं। उदहारण के रूप में हमारे पड़ोसी देश बांग्लादेश में बंगाली भाषा को राष्ट्रभाषा के रूप में मान्यता दी गयी है, और वह सबसे अधिक बंगाली भाषा का प्रयोग किया जाता है।

भारतीय संविधान में भाषाः जब डॉ0 अंबेडकर द्वारा संविधान का निर्माण हो रहा था, उस समय राष्ट्रभाषा का प्रश्न उठा था। उस समय डॉ0 अंबेडकर ने राष्ट्रभाषा के रूप में संस्कृत को मान्यता देने का सुझाव दिया गया था, परन्तु इसका विरोध होने लगा, जिस कारण संस्कृत को राष्ट्रभाषा नहीं माना गया। हालाँकि संविधान सभा में कई लोग हिन्दी को राष्ट्रभाषा के रूप में चाहते थे, परन्तु गैर हिन्दी क्षेत्र के लोगों ने इसका विरोध किया, जिसके कारण संविधान सभा ने किसी भी भाषा को राष्ट्रभाषा के रूप में मान्यता नहीं दी।
